Free Wi-Fi Service Widely Available at King Library

San José State University Expands Wireless Internet Access for General Public

SAN JOSE, CALIF.— An enhanced level of free Wi-Fi service is now available to members of the public using the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Library. As a result of network modifications made by San José State University and the Associated Students of San José State University, all laptop users with a valid San Jose library card will have full Internet access when using the University's Wi-Fi network within the King Library. Previously Wi-Fi access at King Library had been limited to use of the library's web pages, catalog and databases, the San José State University and the City of San José web pages. This latest development offers library card holders more flexibility and convenience. In addition, with few exceptions *on-site* visitors will have access to the full range of both SJSU and SJPL subscribed databases* containing thousands of articles published in magazines, journals, newspapers and other reference resources.

“We are committed to making broad and equitable access to information resources available to all visitors to the King Library,” said University Library Dean Ruth Kifer. “Eliminating the barriers to full Wi-Fi Internet access is an important step towards achieving that goal and effectively increases the Library's capability for full Internet access beyond the existing 400 networked computers and 600 laptop ports.”
